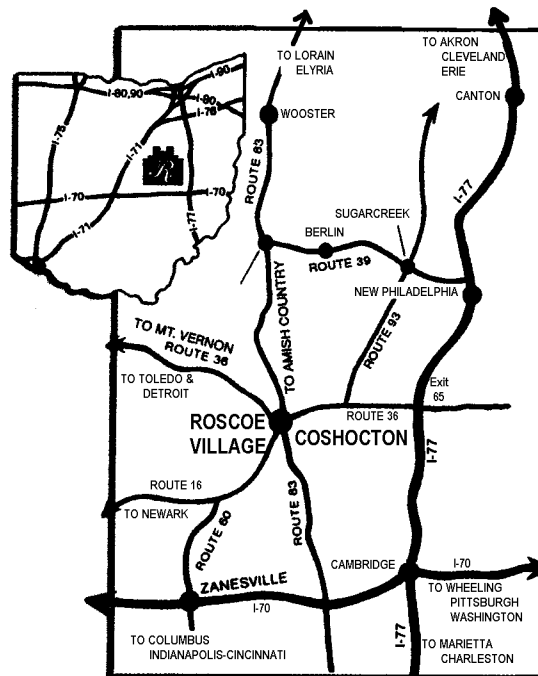

Hands-On Canal Era Crafts

All Roscoe Village hands-on activities are based on crafts practiced during the Canal Era.

featured activities . . .

Candle Dipping

Using their fingers and a piece of pre-cut candle wicking, participants hand-dip the wick to form their personal small pair of candles.



Tin Punching

Practice the craft of a tinsmith. Participants will transform a simple piece of tin into a decorative ornament.

Top Painting

Participants are invited to decorate a wooden top, a 19th century favorite toy, using washable paint. (Paint shirts are not provided.)

Monticello III Canal Boat

No trip to Roscoe Village is complete without a relaxing cruise along a 1 1/2 mile stretch of canal in the horse drawn Monticello III. A part of the Lake Park Recreational Complex, the forty-five minute ride allows your family to experience this four mile per hour mode of early transportation. The canal boat captain provides the passengers with a little insight into life on the canal during its 1800s heyday.



Johnson-Humrickhouse Museum

The nationally accredited Johnson-Humrickhouse Museum has four permanent exhibit galleries: American Indian, Historic Ohio, Decorative Arts and East Asian. A fifth gallery displays temporary exhibits that range in topics from art to history.
